












EDES interventions in ACP COUNTRIES – Oct. 2012

Objectives

- SPS systems OK for EU in countries of origin (principle of equivalence)
- Support ACP countries in reinforcement their national /regional food safety system (growing demand for national systems)


Means

- Assist implementation of a Food Safety Policy
- Support implementation of risk assessment (where requested)
- Enhance risk management (controls, labs)
- Set up tailored, sustainable and economically viable systems
- Build a scalable system in order to adapt to new problems in the long term (e.g. reassess self assement guides along with regulations changes)



Logical framework : Expected results from EDES = 4 key dimensions to manage



GOVERNANCE SYSTEMS

Gaps are identified, and risk-based animal health, plant health and food safety systems are strengthened in line with Regulation (EC) No 882/2004 and effectively coordinated in consultation with stakeholders

OPERATIONAL PROCESSES

Food and feed inspection services operate efficiently, effectively, independently and transparently to carry out acceptable controls, according to EU standards

Technically competent and sustainable laboratory services are supported to be available at national or regional level to provide efficient, effective and economically viable food testing to official and industry clients, applying principles of accreditation

Management of change process

MANAGEMENT OF SKILLS Strengthened local capacity and expertise to provide training and advisory services in food safety and control systems, with emphasis on services to small-scale producers, processors and exporters

COMMUNICATION AND RELATIONSHIP DYNAMICS






